Dear Parents/Guardians

As we reach the end of the academic year, I would just like to update you on our progress against our Ofsted targets. As a Leadership team we have been working hard with our Interim Executive Board to comprehensively review our monitoring and safeguarding policies and systems.

Actions to date:

- The updated safeguarding policy is on the website
- Students know who is responsible for safeguarding
- Our new safeguarding team address all safeguarding issues on a daily basis
- Our three Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSL) have all updated their Surrey DSL training
- We are ensuring that staff have up to date knowledge about safeguarding topics and procedures
- Our physical intervention policy and systems has been updated and the new policy is on the website

We have had positive feedback from a recent safeguarding review that included our systems for safer recruitment. The review interviewed staff and students and said that:

- Students feel positive, safe and cared for
- Staff take collective shared responsibility for safeguarding
- The pace of change is positive

We have also updated our Y7/8 Curriculum and made some changes for September in order to respond to feedback from students in KS3 about afternoon lessons. In Year 7 and 8 we have removed double lessons which students found too long. We have also developed a core curriculum that runs in the morning comprising of English, Maths, Science and other core subjects. In the afternoons we are running a Creative Curriculum with subjects such as Art, Music, Drama.

Last week we also had a review of our pupil premium strategy and will be responding to the review recommendations in the autumn term.

After such a busy year we hope everyone has a happy and safe summer break and look forward to seeing students on Thursday 5th Sept.
